Future Rec Day Fees

Rec Day entry fees – from 2021 were Demo \$30, Rookies \$50, Juniors \$50, Seniors \$120 – Use these fees for 12 February Practice/Recreational RideDay at Lismore.

A lot of discussion was held about possible fee increases and the current cost of living situation. Rider entry fees need to possibly increase due to Permit application increases, rider levy increases, first aid costs, MNSW affiliation increase. This could affect rider participation at our events.

N Rankin proposed Motion to continue with current fees and reassess at June event as to whether we need to increase, looking at income and expenses from each event. Voting by show of hands – All in Favour.

D Maguire – if we receive loan from MNSW for track extensions, the Club needs to run them.

JUNIORS RIDING WITH SENIORS - Ned	Juniors riding with Seniors for discussion/motion. Has previously been voted on twice by senior members as a definite no at 2 different general meetings. Ned brought up that due to dropping the Jnr 400 class, we could use Jnrs riding with Snrs on the larger bikes (allowed for Jnrs) instead. This could also assist with promoting the club and believes that those who are riding these bikes are usually more responsible. Further discussion to follow dependent on whether we receive requests. Also G Thomas needs to confirm Office of Sport approval.
FUTURE PLANNING, OFFICIALS/MARSHALLS	Out of pocket expenses for Officials and Marshalls & Flag marshalls to be confirmed prior to the commencement of an event. Ned commented that it is unfair to competitors who pay to enter to have on dummy grid for flag marshals to be allocated and makes us look unprofessional. He would like Flag Marshalls to be organised before event. Perhaps source outside groups. Suggestion was made to make an ad for social media to advertise for future events that we are looking for marshals and best way to view racing being trackside. This is an ongoing issue across the whole of sport. The Club also needs more Officials, timing operators. M Adamson commented we need to look at different ways to encourage more members to actively participate. ACTION — Ned to make up some ads for attracting marshals and other officials.
